
Subject: - Acceptance of Website-generated Title Verification Letters

Sir,

As part of its effort towards greater transparency and effective functioning, RNI is now placing the title verification letters on its official website: www.rni.nic.in for your convenience as well as the publishers. Publishers can now download a copy from our website and file the declaration to begin with. However, it has come to our notice that website-generated copies of the title verification letters are not being accepted by your office. This is causing inconvenience to the publishers and defeating the very purpose of using technology for efficient functioning.

2. In case of any doubt, the authenticity of the title verification letter can be checked from the website. It is therefore, requested that your office may please be advised to accept the website-generated copies of the title verification letters to avoid further inconvenience to the publishers.

3. Some publishers have also complained about inordinate delay in your office in forwarding the Declaration for starting publication. I would request you to look into the matter so that the publishers do not face any harassment.
